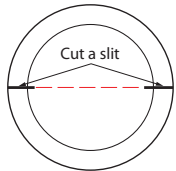
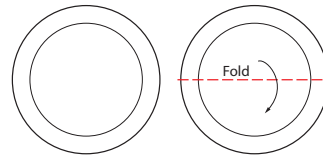


Paper Plate Sheep

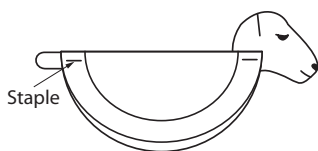
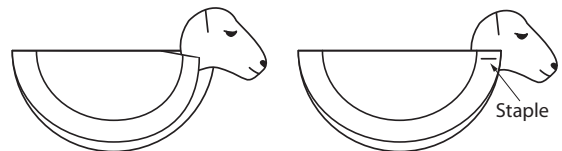
<p>1 Paper plate Cotton wool balls Colour card</p>	<p>Stapler Staples</p>	<p>Glue Scissors</p>
--	----------------------------	--------------------------

Use a paper plate and fold in half with the underside inwards.
Make a good crease along the fold and open out.



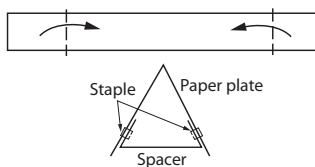
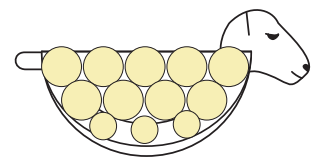
Cut a 2 cm slit on one side and a 4 cm slit on the other side on the crease.
(One side will be for the tail and the other side is for the head.)

Cut out the head from card.
Open out the larger cut slit and place the head in the gap.
Staple in place.



Cut out the tail from card.
Open out the other slit and place the tail in the gap.
Staple in place.

Put some glue all over one half of the body of the sheep (plate) and press some cotton wool balls into the glue.
Do the same on the other side.
Leave to dry.



Cut a strip of card to use as a spacer.
Fold up the two ends and staple these to the paper plate.
Make sure that the spacer does not sit at the bottom of the plate.
This will keep the plates apart and help the sheep to rock backwards and forwards.

Lastly cut out the ears.
Cut a slit in the head of the sheep.
Place the ears in the slit.
