

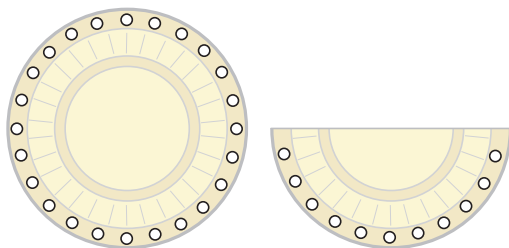
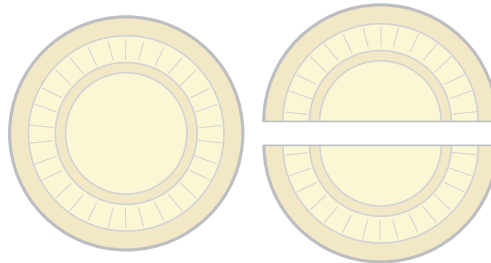
# Hanging Wall Pocket

2 plain paper plates  
Single hole punch  
Yarn, twine or thick thread

Scissors  
Stickers  
Felt tip pens

Thick needle (optional)  
Nail varnish (optional)

Use two paper plates.  
Cut one paper plate in half.  
Discard one half.



Put the whole plates onto the table, face upwards.

Turn the half plate over so that the eating side is facing the whole plate

Hold these plates together to form a pocket.

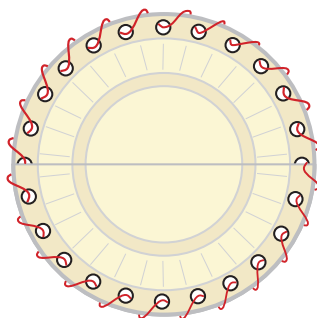
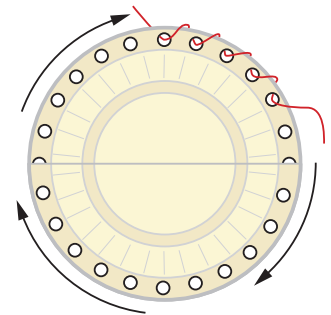
While holding them together, punch holes around the outside edge.

Sew all the edges with yarn, string, or twine, going from the back to the front of each hole.

Use an upholstery needle.

Alternatively put a bit of nail polish on the end of the cord (let it dry first). This will act like a needle and make it easier for threading.

When you come to the end, tie the two ends of the cord securely at the back of the plate and trim off any excess after the knot.



Use the top hole for hanging the wall pocket on the wall.

Decorate the wall pocket with crayons, markers, or paint.
