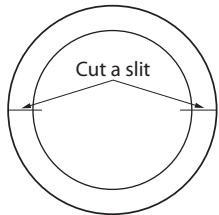
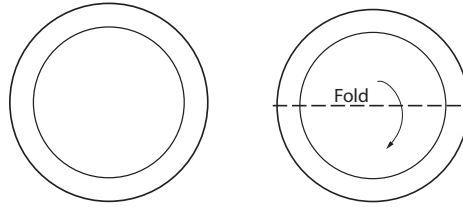


Pecking Bird

<p>1 Paper plate Tissue paper</p>	<p>Stapler Staples</p>	<p>Colour card Scissors</p>
---------------------------------------	----------------------------	---------------------------------

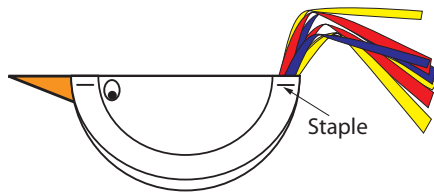
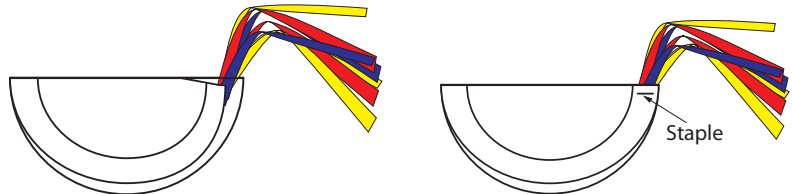
Use a paper plate and fold in half.
Make a good crease along the fold and open out.



Cut a 2 cm slit either side on the crease.
(One side will be for the tail and the other side is for the beak.)

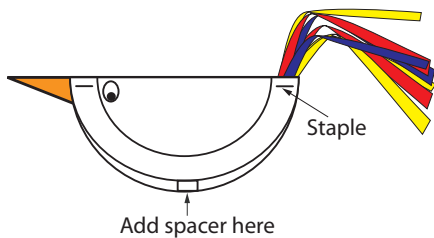
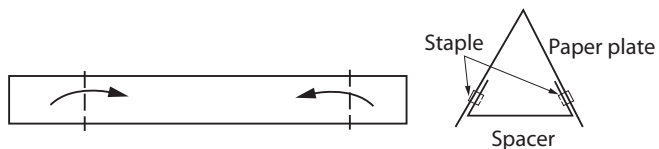
Cut some strips of tissue paper (1.0–1.5 cm wide) in the colour required for the tail.

Open out one slit and place the tail tissue strips in the gap and staple in place.



Cut a triangle of yellow or orange card for the beak.
Place this at the other slit in the plate and staple in place.

Cut a strip of card to use as a spacer.



Fold up the two ends and staple these to the paper plate. Make sure that the spacer does not sit at the bottom of the place.
This will keep the plates apart and help the bird to rock backwards and forwards.
